CaptPoulsom gives tho following, most interesting, history of the frontal ^{If}When the 6th Battalion arrived in India in 1942 it. was the only Unit of the "British 36th Division which had not got its own Altar Frontal. This fact came "to the knowledge of tho Rector of St Mary's Church, Poone. To our amazement," some months later the Anglican Sisters attached to that Church presented us" with the Frontal now in the Daring Chapol. It is hand woven and was dedicated at the Camp at Kharakvalsa (Bombay Presidency) on Sunday 23rd November 1943 by the Regimental Chaplain - the Revd R.S.Sparrow. Subsequently it accompanied the Un it through the Burma Campaign and was used when conditions permitted "for Holy Communion to many who never came back".

I ask you to note carefully the Services for August. I am concerned to know what is best for times of services especially in the evening and for this month we shall continue to alternate between the two Churches at 6,30 p.m.

I hope the daily ringing of a bell for morning and evening prayer will help us all to lift up our hearts together, and know that as Christians every day should be begun, continued and ended in Christ. I do not expect many to be able to come to the week-day services as yet, though I am sure those who can will find great strength. The week day bell is not so much a call to Church as a oall to prayer wherever you are and whatever you are doing.

We are faced with the repair and restoration of our Church buildings; there is a great deal to be done at both Churches and certainly St Nicholas1 will take a long time. Many of you will know the satisfaction that oomes from doing a job in your own house - decorating a room, making or mending a piece of furniture, or improvements in the garden. We shall have to use the same methods in God's House and God's acre under expert supervision and I am sure we shall find an abiding satisfact - ion in having done something with our hands for God. I shall be looking for volunteers, young and old, expert and inexpert (but the latter must be patient and humble enough to try again) I shall be particularly interested to hear of any who would like to try working the local stone.

But all our work of repairing the Church Buildings must be a constant reminder of our still more important task of repairing The Church - the blessed company of all faithful people - the Holy Catholick Church in Pluckley. This we must work at every day; by prayer for those who by their absence from the fellow- ship are broken pillars, dead lights; by the quality of our life and work; by charity, which is true love and friendship between us all.
