THE ARCHBISHOPS' APPEAL FOR £100,000 FOR THE CHURCH IN CHINA. The Archbishops, in their appeal, say:- "For eight years China has been in the fiery furnace of war on its own soil. Out of the furnace the Church in china, through its Bishops, calls to the sister Churches of the Anglican Communion for help, that it may rebuilt the waste places, and gird itself to seize opportunities that may never recur. It is a call that must not bedenied." We are asked to give a free gift to the Church in China from the Church of England. Why China (1) Because, in all the world, China offers the Church its greatest opportunity, one in four of the world's population lives in China, The Church in China "by its stedfastness, courage and devotion in time of war, has opened wide many doors in Chinas. (2) Because, in all the world, the Chinese Church most deserves and needs our help., IIts prewar record of self-support was unsurpassed. But now the country has been revaged by eight years of war, the Church is left in a dire state of poverty, in a nation with 50 million refugees, 30 million homeless, 2 million orphans. Half its Bishops and 80% of its leading laymen were in captivity. Its buildings have been destroyed, its man-power dispersed. We feel sure that there are many in Pluckley who would like to join in this "Gift to China", and contributions will be thankfully received by the Rector,
