RE-SELLING THE DERING DOMAIN.

There is always something pathetic about the passing of ancient heritages, and the sharp raps of the autioneer's hammer at Ashford, on Thursday, stirred discordant feelings in those of a sensitive temperament. The family claim as the original title deed, a Saxon grant by Godwin, Earl of Kent, dated 1016; this being in the possession of Sir Henry Dering, who has quite recently left the district and is now living at Hythe. The property has been recently purchased by the vendor, Mr. T. Place, of Northallerton, Yorkshire, from Mr. Arthur C. Rampton and Mr. Percy W. The estate comprises about 3,185 acres in six parishes, the mansion overlooking one of the finest deer parks in England. The village of Pluckley was included, practically in its entirety, in the sale. The furniture, ancestral pictures, etc., as well as the live and dead stock, will be sold nex
